2010 was an exciting year for the Falstaff Experience Tudor World. The Tudor World brand began to increase school visit numbers and since then a whole new innovative education programme has been developed. To increase value for money the museum introduced live shows and interactive quiz trails. The efforts of the museum were recognised when the Falstaff Experience was awarded a Godiva Gold Award.

The development of the education program continued in 2011 with several online learning schemes and resources. Entertainment continued to thrive with more new live shows and special themed events and weeks. The Falstaff Experience has recently been announced as Chiltern Railways Attraction of Year and the team are excited to host the launch of next year's award.

Education

The Falstaff Experience Tudor World has excelled over the last twelve months in developing its fantastic value for money education packages. These include the popular half day experience of History Tour, Crime & Punishment show and Henry VIII Tudor warfare workshop. The Falstaff Experience has also developed a ground breaking Leisure and Tourism Education experience.

As part of its commitment to the 'Kids In Museums Manifesto' the Falstaff Experience also offers different characters for visitors to meet as well as the opportunity to email them with questions. This service is free of charge. The museum is also excited to be offering free after school clubs on Thursdays from September.

The Royal Wedding

The Falstaff Experience took a leading role in organising the Sheep Street Royal Wedding Street party. The museum provided free entertainment including a performance of 'Much Ado About Nothing', a Beheading show and historical battle recreations. The museum worked closely alongside many different businesses and organisations including Weatherspoons, Café Rouge, Stratforward BID and Stratford District Council. The event was held in support of the charities CLIC Sargent and Help for Heroes and raised well over £1000.

Shows

From October 2010 the Falstaff Experience began to offer free shows at peak times to heighten the visitor experience and increase the value for money. The shows have proved popular with adults and children mixing history with entertainment and engaging all those who have seen them. Visitors have been able to enjoy 'A History of Halloween', 'Shakespeare's Vile Villains', 'Tudor Crime and Punishment', 'The Tudor Spy' and 'The Turbulent Times of Sir John Falstaff'. The shows are interactive and encourage audience participation.

Christmas

Santa Clause came to the Falstaff Experience in December 2010 and met the boys and girls of Stratford on the two weekends before Christmas. Every child left with a little present and memories to cherish.

The Stratford Town Haunted Pub Walk

Stratford found a new hero in 2011; Dashing Jack. Our pirate guide leads guests on tour of haunted Stratford stopping off at 3 of Stratford's most haunted pubs for drinks and nibbles that are all included in the price. The 3 hour night time romp around town is an adult experience perfect for celebrating Valentines, Bank Holidays and ideal for works Christmas party.

Visitors were able to meet Henry VIII himself and some of his wives at various times throughout the week. Every visitor also received a small present from Henry VIII to say thank you for coming to his week-long birthday party. The museum offered free entry to anyone who could demonstrate proof they were called Henry and, as a special treat, groups of 8 (must be 8 no more or no less) could enter the museum for an 8th of the price just £20.00. It was a unique way to mark the Birthday of England's most notorious monarch.

Tudor Olympics
